



Marlboro Travel Club Program Details

- Travel league play for ages 8 & up will run concurrent with the Marlboro Little League seasons (spring and fall). Tournament play will begin following the conclusion of each Marlboro Little League season. **Participants must commit to be available from April 1st through JULY 31st.** Participation in the MBTC takes priority over participation in other recreational or travel sports (i.e., basketball, soccer, football, etc.). Additional tournaments and leagues will be available from September 1st through possibly mid-November and require similar commitment. Additionally, Winter Training, beginning in January and ending in April is a requirement to prepare for the spring season. All players must make themselves available for winter training to be considered for MBTC participation. Participation in Marlboro Little League takes precedence over MBTC practice and games. Participants (managers, coaches and players) in addition to parent(s), found in violation of this rule may be subject to disciplinary action or other penalties as determined by the disciplinary committee.
- The Little League District 19 tournament, which starts in late June, takes precedence over the MBTC program. In the event of a scheduling conflict between Little League District 19 Tournament games and MBTC practices or games, the District 19 Tournament always takes precedence. Participants (managers, coaches and players) in addition to parent(s), found in violation of this rule may be subject to disciplinary action or other penalties as determined by the disciplinary committee.
- The first formed team in each division will be known as the "Gold" or "A" team. In divisions (age groups) where the skill level of participants warrant, multiple teams may be formed. Divisions warranting multiple teams will have a second team formed known as the "Blue" or "B" team and in some cases a third team known as the "Gray" or "C" team. Participants are required to play for the team to which they are assigned. If needed, Managers within a division can request a player from another team to fill a roster for a particular game or tournament.
- Attendance at practices and games is a crucial component to a successful team and to a successful program. Parents are expected to make every effort to clear their child's schedule to avoid conflicts. Poor attendance is unfair to teammates and the coaching staff and will result in a player's dismissal from the program. Participants are not permitted to play on any other travel baseball team whose season runs concurrent with the MBTC season. Parents are expected to schedule family vacations around their MBTC commitment.
